Remembering Oline Reynolds



Oline Miller Reynolds, 81, of Bainbridge, GA, passed away Sunday, April 20, 2014, at her residence.

Mrs. Reynolds was born September 24, 1932, in Climax, GA, the daughter of Louis Olice Miller and Lucy Cornelia Gill Miller. She was a graduate of Climax High School and received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Mount Berry College. She did graduate work at Mercer University and the University of Florida, and taught school for several years at Baker County High School and Cairo High School. She was a homemaker and a member of First United Methodist Church. She was very active in the Decatur County Historical Society and served as an officer in the Historic Chattahoochee Commission.

She loved growing and working with roses. She was a Past District Director and served on the board of the American Rose Society. She was a member of the World Federation of Rose Societies with whom she was an internationally known and accredited rose judge.

Survivors include her husband of 57 years, Reuben Matthew Reynolds, Jr. of Bainbridge, GA; her sons, Reuben Matthew Reynolds, III of Boston, MA, Joseph M. “Jay” Reynolds of Atlanta, GA, and John B. Reynolds of Bainbridge, GA; and her grandchildren, Reuben A. Reynolds, Lucille A. Reynolds, Anne M. Reynolds, and John C. Reynolds. She was preceded in death by her brothers, Gill Miller, Bill Miller, and Carney Miller.

“...I use the term “lady” with feeling. Oline is always ladylike with a knack for making people feel welcome and loved. She opens her home and her heart to everyone.

Oline was born in Decatur County, Georgia, and grew up during the hard times of the depression. Her Daddy, L.O. Miller, was a farmer and her mother, Cornelia Gill Miller, was a teacher. Oline graduated from Climax High School and then proceeded to work her way through Berry College. She then studied advanced mathematics at Mercer College and the University of Florida, becoming a teacher of mathematics at the High School level.

Oline married Reuben M. Reynolds, Jr., in 1956 and they have three highly successful sons, and four grandchildren. The devotion they hold for each other is evident to everyone who has ever seen them together.”



Oline and Reuben were always welcoming people to their home and garden (with more than 1200 roses!). The first two DSD Mid-Winter Meetings were held in Bainbridge, with receptions at their home on Friday nights. People had enough fun that the MWMs have continued. By the time I started attending judges schools in 2000, the tradition of dinner at Oline and Reuben’s house was well established. I caught Alice Boyd and Karen Radde heading into the garden at the 2008 judges school.

Well, we’re standing on a road leading to the back garden when she comes riding up in a John Deere four wheeler. She looked like she was ready for a safari – and bigger than life!

Later, she tells us she’s a share cropper’s daughter. Growing up she never had a ceiling in her homes. Then, quote: “She’s an old maid school teacher” meets and marries Mr. Reynolds and the rest is history.

Oline pointed out her beautiful stained glass windows and told how she sends out her two sons to steal or salvage the windows before the town demolishes a building. She told of a chandelier



crashing from the ceiling, and scaring them in the night!

I just fell in love with her and wanted her to be my grandma. Oline couldn't have been more accommodating and downright friendly to every one of us! Oline is one of my most memorable characters to meet in this life."

Horticulture Judges Review



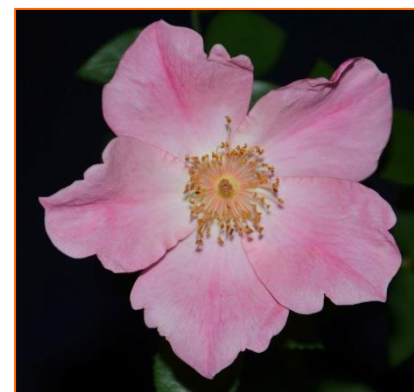

Summer has arrived in the Deep South District. My roses here in Central Florida are about a third of their normal size already and it is getting more and more unpleasant to be in the garden. We can look forward to the return of excellent roses in the fall but, right now, we just need to maintain them in reasonable shape without getting heatstroke.

I judged two shows this season. The Jacksonville Rose Show was much better than I have seen in a while. Selecting winners from the many excellent miniflora and miniature rose entries was particularly challenging but lots of fun. The Tampa show was affected by unseasonably hot weather that limited the number of entries. The show was small but the awards table still had many fine specimens. I heard that the Georgia rose shows were quite good this year and that is gratifying. All judges need to work with their societies to continue having rose shows and make them successful. We need to both exhibit as well as judge. Age is taking its toll on our cadre of DSD judges and we are not replacing retirements. Please try to judge shows when asked.

I have been asked to address an issue that arose at the recent Thomasville Rose Show. There was a complaint that an entry, 'Tomboy', was "pushed aside" by judges who were unfamiliar with it. This rose is not currently listed in either the *Handbook for Selecting Roses* or the *Combined Rose List 2014*. Judges often carry one or both of these references while judging. But this rose is found in the *Modern Roses Database* on the ARS website and in the published editions of *Modern Roses*. It states that 'Tomboy' is a single, medium pink, miniature rose (5 petal) bred by Herb Zipper. It is no longer in commerce but can still be found in many gardens. Therefore, the rose should have been given the same consideration as any

other entry. As I was not there, I cannot say that it was not given proper consideration but apparently several individuals believe it was not. Checking the online *Modern Roses Database* would have determined that it was eligible for an award. This unfortunate episode is another reason why judges need to have access to this resource while in the process of judging rose shows. I just learned how to pull up the *Database* on both my iPad and iPhone. Most of the roses we encounter can be found in the handbooks we carry, but occasionally one shows up that is hard to find. I believe that it is important that all of us judges make every effort to fairly evaluate entries. I know that many of us, including me, are not that tech savvy, but we owe it to the exhibitors to be familiar with how to access the *Modern Roses Database*. I figured out how to access it on the smart phone I carry in my pocket and you can as well.

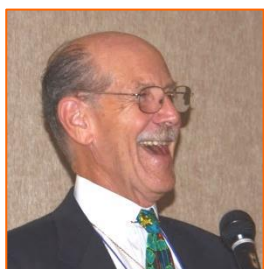
Several of our DSD judges have lapsed in meeting their four-year audit requirement and are now placed on “inactive” status. An inactive judge cannot judge rose shows but can be reinstated to active status upon completion of either a school or seminar. The inactive judge does not need to retake the Horticultural Judges Exam.

The Deep South District website has been under renovation. I have submitted the latest list of active DSD horticultural judges to the District website and it is now listed at <http://deepsouthdistrict.org/> under “Organization”. I will be happy to send a current list to any show chairperson requesting one. At this point, I have received only one such request.

Three of our current judges have recently moved to emeritus status. **William (“Billy”) Franklin, Anna Price, and Dr. William E. Price** are now horticultural judges emeriti of the Deep South District. We thank them for their many years of service and wish them well in the future.

In the Deep South District, the spring show season has come and gone. More crazy weather made it difficult to predict what we would have for the shows this year. He did a terrific job representing the DSD.

We will have a “for credit” arrangement workshop at the Fall DSD Convention in Gainesville, FL, October 31 – November 2. We are open to suggestions for a topic, so if there are any areas you would like to see explored, please contact me.

Now that the spring rose shows are over for 2014, Consulting Rosarians can concentrate on other matters, like keeping our society members informed as to what’s new, how to and where items can be found. We also should be looking for new talents and enthusiastic members that will make good new society and ARS CRs. With an aging active CR list, I see our ranks of folks getting fewer and fewer each year. Many have elected the CR Emeritus status. With this choice these folks are taken off the Active ARS List and also should be removed from your society’s active list. In short, we need new CRs to keep the societies’ work flowing and our people informed. I am always interested in hearing about new CR candidates so let me know if you have someone in mind.

We have a deadline coming up very soon for Master Rosarian nominations. The 2014 Master Rosarian Candidate application forms must be approved by the District Awards Committee and sent to ARS by August 1st. I have contacted a few CRs who meet the 10 active CR requirements but only have a couple of responses back. This is an honor for your service, so take advantage of this opportunity to be recognized.

Each year I am confronted with the same CR issue. Some CRs have become inactive without knowing it. The major problem involves the non-renewal of ARS membership. When the membership lapses I do not get a notice that a CR was dropped for this reason, so I cannot give a reminder. The only way I find this out is to check the new ARS Active list at the beginning of each year. Even then I may miss someone who was on the ARS Active list last year. I am finding that most are forgetting to pay their ARS membership dues. I would suggest you mark your calendar when your statement comes if you need to wait before paying it. Being on fixed incomes I’m finding out there are times when things to be paid just need to be set aside for a while and marking the calendar does help. Once you are inactive only our National CR Chairman, *Cindy Dale*, can approve reinstatement without re-testing, so please keep up your ARS membership.

It is not too soon to be thinking about the next CR school and what you need to do if you would like to be tested for the CR program. I have all the information you



need and am ready to get you started. The test is a very simple, open book exam. Most candidates complete the exam in about one hour and most score in the 90% range. I hope you will consider this new dimension of rose growing.

I want to express my thanks to all you CRs who keep plugging along. Let me know if you see any new candidates. Have a pleasant and safe summer.

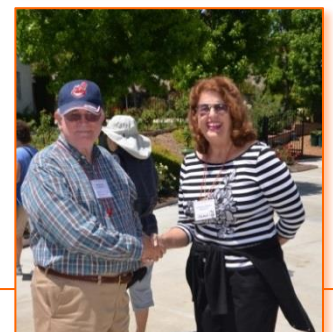

"Mother of All Rose Shows" The 2014 ARS National Show & Convention in San Diego

On Mother's Day weekend a Who's Who of rosarians gathered at the Town & Country Resort in San Diego to exhibit, speak, judge, tour gardens, socialize, and be entertained. Of course, the National ARS Leadership was there with President Jolene Adams, Vice President Pat Shanley, immediate Past President Jeff Wyckoff, and Jeffrey Ware, Executive Director and Editor of *American Rose* magazine. Other notables, like Bob Martin, Tommy Cairns, and Baldo Villegas were also accessible at every turn.

There were roses like you've never seen. The scope of a National Show is something to behold, especially in the land of the Rose Parade. To judge the massive displays a distinguished panel of 63 judges was recruited from all over the country – forty-six were needed to judge in Horticulture, ten in Artistic Arrangements, and seven in the Photography competition.

Our own esteemed judges from the Deep South District (DSD) included *Karen & Clarence Prevatt, Kitsy Mostellar*, and *Bobbie Reed*. Other attendees from the DSD were *Fermin & Laura Rodriguez, Buddy & Charlayne Woods*, and *Connie Vierbicky* (speaker on English Roses), all from either the Tampa or Bradenton-Sarasota rose societies. *Don Schwarz* from the Greater Atlanta RS was in the middle of everything; *Wendy Tilley* and *Paul Colombo* were there, too, also from Atlanta.

The hosting society from San Diego has 300 members and did an excellent job of coordinating the presentations, activities, and show set up. It took two programs of 40-50 pages each just to list the separate offerings for the convention and the show. By the way, there were 450 paid public attendees at the show in addition to conference registrants. Also remember, when we complain about rising costs and availability of local show space, the SDRS has to pay \$5,000 each year to hold their local event.

Now, about the SHOW. Exhibitors were allowed to work all night in the hallway prep areas alongside the massive exhibit hall, and many did so. When I began setting up at 6am, I was chagrined to find that I was about the last exhibitor to arrive.

One of the best reasons to attend a National Rose Show is to experience our hobby at the "Big League" level and to be truly inspired by those who serve as examples of the ultimate in growing and showing roses. One such Eastern Seaboard representative is Dr. Satish Prabhu. Although not a member of the DSD, we'd like to claim him. It feels as though he is one of us, being from nearby Columbia, SC, and a frequent winning exhibitor throughout the DSD.

Satish gave an extensive and humorous presentation on how to pack and fly with your roses. As a multiple past winner of national challenge trophies, he shared his elaborate methods of protecting perfectly grown roses for exhibition. This show was no exception, as he won nine top trophies for exhibiting collections of hybrid teas, floribundas, miniatures and OGRs in the prestigious national challenge class competition. Included was the Best in Show Trophy. The hybrid tea King of Show was his with 'Gemini' and the miniature King with 'Soroptimist International'. Hybrid tea Queen was 'Moonstone' from Gary Bulman, and miniature Queen was 'Arcanum' from Bob Martin. Additional Prabhu entries won several other classes; need I say more?

Working alongside Satish in the prep area is a memorable learning experience. His carefully packed beauties, stacked in custom-made racks, came across the country in temperature-controlled coolers. Each bloom, of many dozens, were pre-groomed and labeled with paper name tags held together with surgical tape for easy removal. He and his wife Vijaya were models of frenzied efficiency as they selected their best-of-the-best blooms for entry in each major Class.

Time was flying for exhibitors. A few paces down the hallway, Program Chair Bob Martin's assistants were swirling around gathering vases to help prep his entries. The Rose Show Chair, Linda Clark, was to my left, frantically grooming an array of near-perfect large sprays. She asked a passerby competitor his opinion on whether the inflorescence would be improved by removing a small bud or two. To my right über-arranger Ron Feurer added the finishing touches on one of his dozen or so spectacular arrangements. His eyes were mere slits, after pulling an "all-nighter." Yet he was amazingly civil, willing to share prep space, line-material, even extra roses.

Aurelia C. Scott's 2007 now well-read book *Otherwise Normal People: Inside the Thorny World of Competitive Rose Gardening* describes Type A gardeners in blood sport battle at the National Show. Yes and no; in laid back Southern California, courtesy prevailed in the cramped prep area, yet everyone clearly had one eye on the competition. Yours truly included. After nine years, I have become one of "them".

I placed my four miniature arrangement entries and carefully evaluated my prospects for ribbons and awards with a trained judge's perspective. It was going to be close, but if I can win just one award, it will be total victory. Rose exhibitor colleagues will see my name in the published results and know I was there.

Ah, sweet success, I won the Mini Artist Award for the best modern mini artistic arrangement, one entitled "Ramble Through the Woods." A modern *free-form* arrangement using no visible container was required. *Ty*, a perfect miniature yellow rose, was held with foam in a wine bottle screw cap and hidden between three pieces of found-on-Sea-Island-beach artistic driftwood, hot glued together for a 3-D effect. An orange colored background set it all off. Needless to say, I am thrilled with the win, the only Award won by an exhibitor from the Deep South District.

Not being known for all work and no play, I managed to find time to squeeze in a visit to the famous San Diego Zoo (got the stuffed panda for grandson), a Padres baseball game at the spectacular PETCO ball park for their tenth anniversary event (missed the foul ball), and a side trip up to Torrey Pines Golf Club (got the hat). Add in perfect weather in the 60's and it was the Mother's Day weekend experience of a life-time.

More from Bobbie Reed:

Saturday afternoon featured sessions for Consulting Rosarians, judges, and the ARS member meeting, which is a brief update based on the results of the recent board meeting of the American Rose Society.

Among other things, we learned that candidates are already lining up for the 2015 ARS election. Bob Martin of California and Sam Jones of Tennessee have announced that they are running for ARS Vice President; the winner will automatically become President in 2018. The ARS Board approved some Consulting Rosarian changes, including a minimum age of 18 for CRs (for liability reasons), and a return to earlier practice that any CR who attends a school will automatically have their status renewed as of the year of that school. [Note: A CR school is now scheduled for August 9, 2014, in Asheville, NC.] The Board also voted to resume publication of the *Official List of Approved Exhibition Names*, my favorite rose resource for rose shows. Finances are in the black at this time (although health care expenses are rising fast), but additional revenue is always needed, through contributions to the Patron's Fund, for instance. We also have a new director for Planned Giving, Laura Pfender.

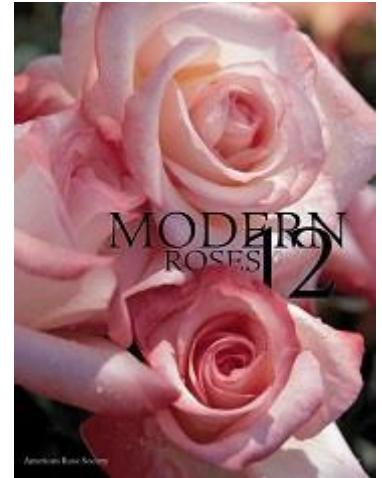

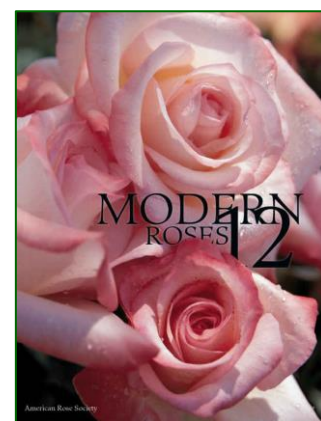

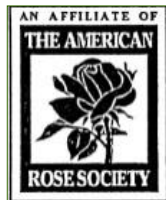
