Exhibitors' Integrated Pest Management often includes the use of chemical insecticides, as well as contact and systemic fungicide applications every two weeks from late February when new foliage emerges through late November when semi-dormancy begins.

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





- Heavily weighted toward disease resistance.
- Modeled on ADR the successful system that has been used in Germany for over 25 years

- And evaluated 5 times during the growing season
- By a team of 2 judges per garden


