#### Basics for Growing Good Roses in Our Area

The following tips will help your roses do their best. Please check with any of our Consulting Rosarians (CRs) for more information on these:

- 1. Have a soil test done by taking a sample to the Fayette County Extension agent. The sample will be sent to UGA for a \$9.00 fee and the report will be back in 7-10 days. The ideal pH for roses is 6.5 but our clay soil is usually acidic so pelletized limestone has to be added. The UGA test report will tell you the pH and levels of major and minor nutrients.
- At the nursery buy only disease-free bushes with at least 3 thick canes.
   Avoid bushes packaged in plastic bags at big box stores.
- Choose a planting site that gets 6-8 hrs of full sun/day, has soil that drains well, and is at least 10 feet away from competing tree roots.
- 4. Plant the bush by digging a 2 ft x 2 ft hole or building raised beds. Mix 1/3 native soil with 1/3 cow manure, and 1/3 soil conditioner or compost. Discard rocks and twigs. Crumble well. Add any other organics that you want to but NO fertilizer until the bush is well established (about 8 weeks later). Fill the hole about 1/2 way with prepared soil. Gently ease the bush out of its pot and plant with the bud union (graft) even with the top of the hole and canes about 2-3" above the top of the hole. Tamp soil down to form a saucer depression and water well every day for the first 10 days then as usual.

- 5. Fertilize your bushes regularly by amending your soil with organics such as manure, compost, etc each year. Supplement this with your choice of a monthly chemical fertilizer like granular 10-10-10, a liquid like Fish Emulsion or Miracle Gro, or a 4-month, slow release like Osmocote.
- 6. Spray with a fungicide every 1-2 weeks. Our CRs can help you design a spray program with chemical or organic products. Locally available products are: Ortho Rose Pride Disease Control, Fertilome Systemic Fungicide, Infuse, or BioAdvanced Disease Control.
- Do NOT spray routinely for insects.
   This will kill off the beneficial bugs that help control the bad bugs.
- 8. Prune the bushes after Valentine's Day, removing dead wood, spindly growth, and any growth pointing toward the center of the bush. Reduce the size of the bush by 1/2 to 2/3. Once blooming roses are pruned AFTER they bloom.
- 9. Deadhead (cut off) spent blooms by cutting just above a leaf with 5 leaflets to stimulate re-blooming throughout the growing season until late October.
- 10. Water the bushes deeply and often at the roots with 2-3 gallons of water once a week in cool weather and 3 times a week in hot weather. Foliage can occasionally be washed down but must be able to dry by sunset to prevent fungal diseases.
- 11. Keep a 3" layer of mulch under and around the roses at all times to decrease weeds, retain moisture, and insulate the roots.
